

**Name**

mysql\_fetch\_lengths - returns an array of length values for the current row

**Synopsis**

```
#include <mysql.h>
```

```
unsigned long * mysql_fetch_lengths(MYSQL_RES * result);
```

**Description**

The mysql\_fetch\_lengths() function returns an array containing the lengths of every column of the current row within the result set (not including terminating zero character) or NULL if an error occurred.

**Parameter**

⊕ result - a result set identifier returned by **mysql\_store\_result(3)** or **mysql\_use\_result(3)**. ### Notes  
mysql\_fetch\_lengths() is valid only for the current row of the result set. It returns NULL if you call it before calling **mysql\_fetch\_row(3)** or after retrieving all rows in the result.

**Return value**

An array of unsigned long values . The size of the array can be determined by the number of fields in current result set.
