mysql_next_result - prepares next result set

Synopsis

```
#include <mysql.h>

int mysql_next_result(MYSQL * mysql);
```

Description

Prepares next result set from a previous call to **mysql_real_query(3)** which can be retrieved by **mysql_store_result(3)** or [mysql_use_result()](())(mysql_use_result). Returns zero on success, nonzero if an error occurred.

Parameter

- ⊕ mysql - a mysql handle, which was previously allocated by **mysql_init(3)** and connected by **mysql_real_connect(3)**.

Notes

- ⊕ If a multi query contains errors the return value of **mysql_errno(3)** and **mysql_error(3)** might change and there will be no result set available.

Return value

Returns zero on success, non zero value on error.
