

NAME

pkg alias - display configured aliases

SYNOPSIS

pkg alias [-q] [-l] [*alias*]

pkg alias [--quiet] [--list] [*alias*]

DESCRIPTION

pkg alias displays configured aliases. If given the name of an existing alias only shows the aliased arguments to **pkg(8)**. Without arguments all aliases and their respective **pkg(8)** arguments are printed.

OPTIONS

The following options are supported by **pkg alias**:

-l, --list

Print all aliases, one alias per line, without their **pkg(8)** arguments.

-q, --quiet

Force quiet output (suppress column headers).

FILES

pkg.conf(5)

EXAMPLES

Display all aliases:

```
% pkg alias
```

Display **pkg(8)** for alias "size":

```
% pkg alias size
```
