

**NAME**

**rwho** - who is logged in on local machines

**SYNOPSIS**

**rwho** [-a]

**DESCRIPTION**

The **rwho** command produces output similar to **who(1)**, but for all machines on the local network. If no report has been received from a machine for 11 minutes then **rwho** assumes the machine is down, and does not report users last known to be logged into that machine.

If a user has not typed to the system for a minute or more, then **rwho** reports this idle time.

The following option is available:

**-a** Include all users. By default, if a user has not typed to the system for an hour or more, then the user will be omitted from the output.

The **rwho** command appeared in 4.3BSD.

**BUGS**

This is unwieldy when the number of machines on the local net is large.
