

NAME

setaudit - set audit session ID

SYNOPSIS

DESCRIPTION

The **setaudit()** system call sets the active audit session ID for the current process from the *au_id_t* pointed to by *au*id.

This system call requires an appropriate privilege to complete.

RETURN VALUES

Upon successful completion, the value 0 is returned; otherwise the value -1 is returned and the global variable *errno* is set to indicate the error.

ERRORS

The **setaudit()** function will fail if:

[EFAULT] A failure occurred while data transferred to the kernel failed.

[EPERM] The process does not have sufficient permission to complete the operation.
