REQUEST ARGUMENTS

conn The XCB connection to X11.

client_major TODO: NOT YET DOCUMENTED.

client_minor TODO: NOT YET DOCUMENTED.

REPLY FIELDS

response_type The type of this reply, in this case *XCB_SELINUX_QUERY_VERSION*. This field is also present in the *xcb_generic_reply_t* and can be used to tell replies apart from each other.

sequence The sequence number of the last request processed by the X11 server.

length The length of the reply, in words (a word is 4 bytes).
